I worked under the Special Academic Advisor, Professor Dr Tong Chee Kiong. However, I also worked closely with Professor Dr Lian Kwen Fee and Dr Asiyah Az-Zahra Ahmad Kumpoh. The anthropological research I was involved in was regarding the Dusun identity and community in Brunei. My tasks were reviewing literature, transcribing, authoring papers and conducting fieldwork. My fieldwork required me to create a network of informants in the Tutong district by engaging on a grassroots level. The research will produce a series of papers about the ethnic Dusun of Brunei.
